This wine has been produced using traditional techniques of open fermentation and basket pressing. Hand-picked fruit was carefully selected and fermented naturally on skins in picking bins. Gentle hand plunging of the individual ferments and minimal working has produced a vibrant wine with bright red berry fruit, spice, and long tannins.

DOC

Introduced in the 1960s. It was the first PDO designation in common with French Appellation Controlee. Specifies the geographical area, permits grape varieties and minimum alcohol level. It may also stipulate the production method, including minimum ageing.

DOCG

DOCG wine must meet all DOC requirements, must be bottled in the region of production and are subject to a Ministry of Agriculture tasting. Each bottle will carry a numbered seal of approval.

IGT

IGT was introduced 1992 equivalent to the French Vin de Pays. IGT regulation permit more freedom in terms of both area and grape and are therefore more prevalent in the south. IGT rules also permit grapes to be sourced from a larger area, a key factor when creating brands.

Timorasso

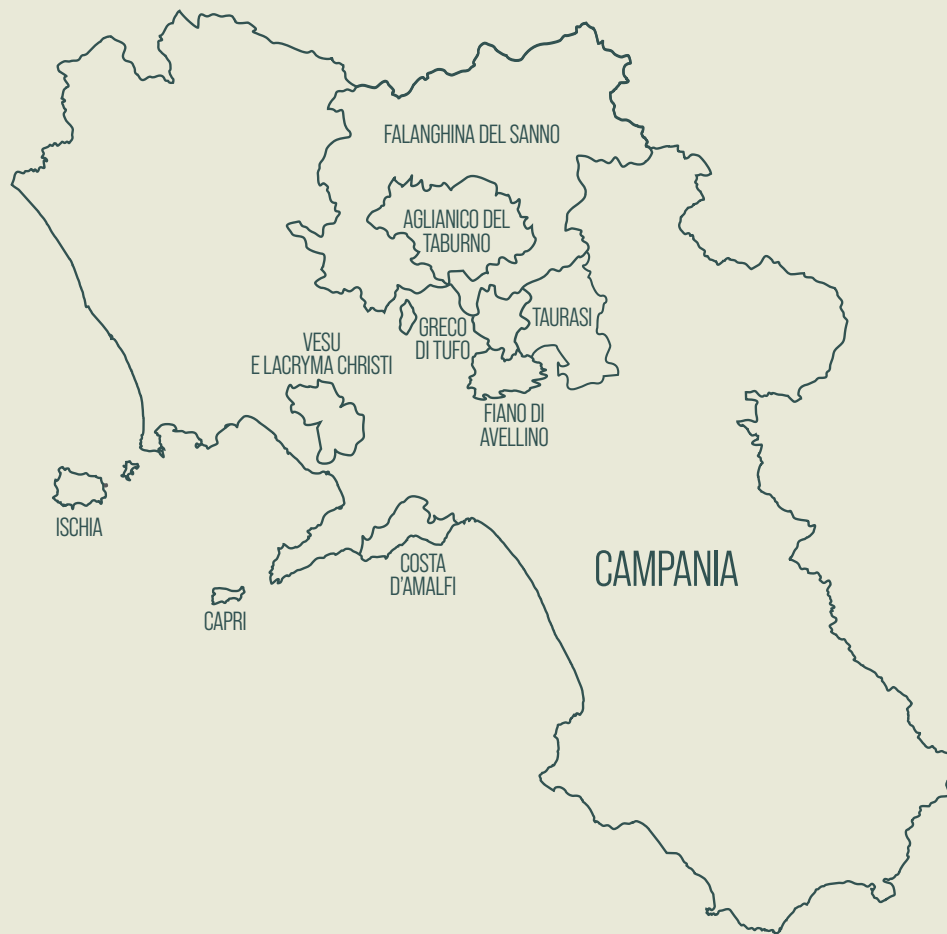

Grapes have been grown in the fertile soil of Campania since ancient times, and one of the pleasures of traveling through this region in southern Italy is the chance to discover the unique varieties of wine produced in this area. From the rolling hillsides in the provinces of Benevento and Avellino to the steeply terraced vineyards of the Amalfi Coast and the islands of Capri and Ischia to the slopes of Mt. Vesuvius, the wines of Campania are as varied as the landscape. There are many excellent regional wines made in Campania, but five classic Campania wines to try are Aglianico, Falanghina, Lacryma Christi del Vesuvio, Piediroso and Greco di Tufo

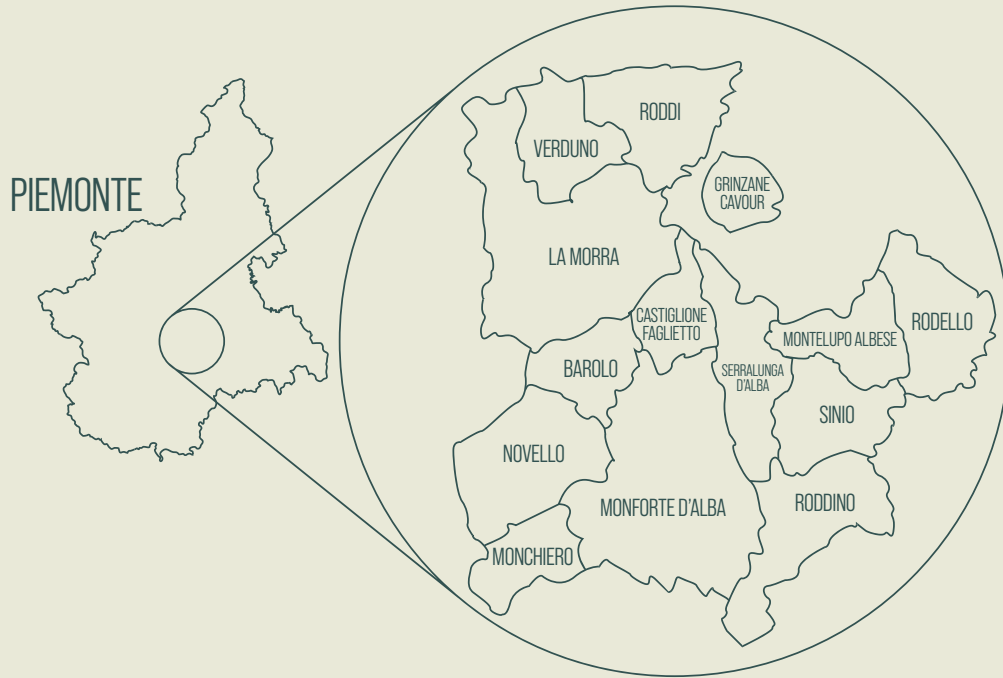

Barolo is based on Nebbiolo, a famous vine type used for other top regional wines like Barbaresco and Gattinara. Barolo does not necessarily indicate a specific definition: the Barolo region in fact includes over 181 distinct geographic producers, which means you have the chance to taste and discover shades and tastes derived from a varied micro-climate and heterogenic soil composition.

Barolo requires a minimum of three years ageing and it best performs no earlier than 10 years. Like any star, Barolo knows how to tease a crowd.



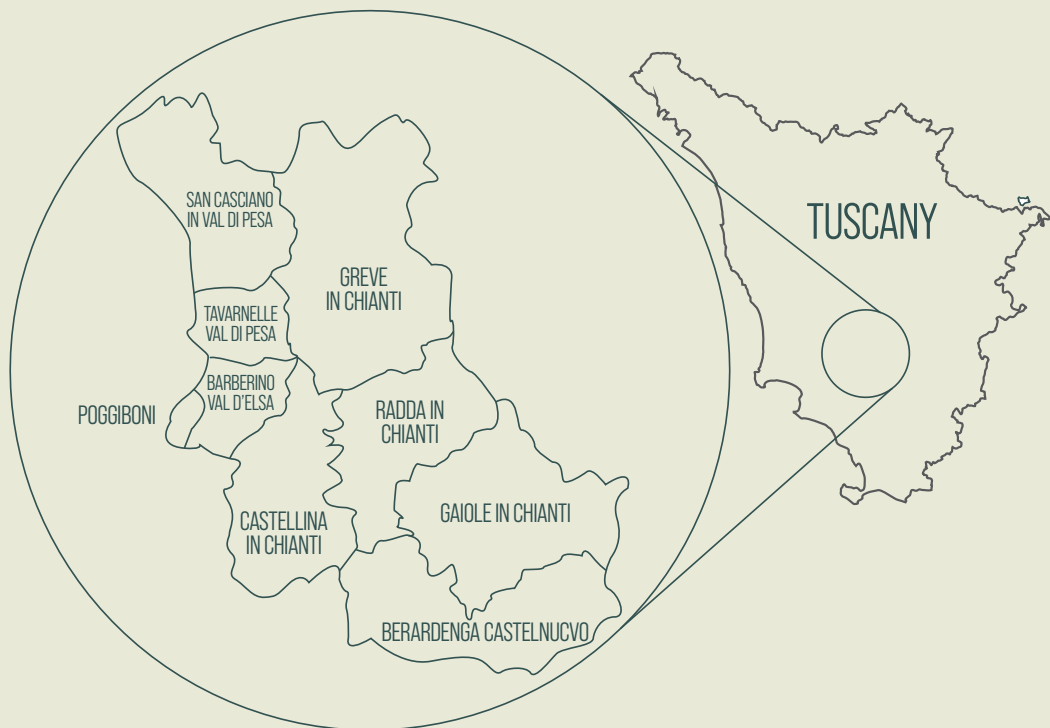

In addition to splendid landscapes, Chianti's popularity is also directly tied to its fine red wines produced in the region and known generally as Chianti wine. The Chianti region, extending roughly over the two main city provinces of Florence and Siena, is characterised by a combination of almost perfect weather and soil that produces a precious wine considered one of the best wines around the world.

The tradition of cultivating vines in Chianti goes back a long time in history, back to the Etruscans that inhabited the area before the Roman empire.

The grape of excellence is Sangiovese, and for a Chianti to bear the word Chianti on the label, not only must it be produced in the Chianti region, but it must also contain at least 80% Sangiovese grapes.

Tuscan Wines of Bolgheri take their place in the sun.

Bolgheri is a relatively young, yet prestigious Italian Appellation located in the Maremma on the Tuscan coast just to the south of Livorno and named after a town in the north of the region. It is known mainly for deeply coloured, supple yet age worthy red wines, usually based on the Bordeaux grape varieties. The winemaking zone features sloping coastal vineyards close to the Tyrrhenian Sea. Wines developed by making unique blends of different grape such us Sangiovese, Syrah, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc drop under the Super Tuscan category.
